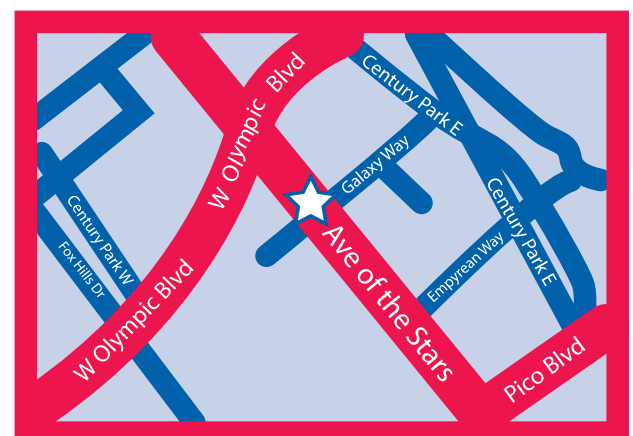

Activity Information

Course Description

The history of HIV/AIDS is short in comparison to other devastating diseases. It has, however, exploded into a global epidemic in a relatively short time; no one can claim ignorance of this global pandemic. It claims African orphans, adolescents, the incarcerated and the elderly. Keeping abreast of current developing information and treatments are vital in the management of HIV/AIDS.

The 9th Annual HIV/AIDS Conference will provide physicians and allied healthcare professionals an environment to explore challenges of HIV infection in a variety of populations including those in developing countries, the adolescent population, the incarcerated and couples considering reproduction.

Educational Objectives

- Summarize the impact of the HIV epidemic worldwide and list issues involved in its spread and factors that impede universal access to diagnosis, management and a much needed research infrastructure, in order to reduce this disease's continuous escalation
- Analyze the current health care worker crisis in the developing world to illustrate key elements important for improvement of services and for decreasing morbidity and mortality
- Predict the impact of co-morbidities among the elderly with HIV infection for optimal evaluation and management of HIV related disease and complications
- Appraise the complex neuropsychiatric issues associated with HIV and the brain from patient's statistics in order to develop appropriate treatment therapies for improved mental stability
- Assess the complex issues unique to the HIV infected adolescent relating to socio-demographics mode of infection, immune status and psychosocial development, to address emerging challenges in patient management and improve quality of life
- Judge the legal and medical issues surrounding confidentiality and disclosure of those with HIV so that appropriate protocols are applied and followed
- Outline the legal and medical issues involved with HIV infected couples considering reproduction and counsel on options for conception and child-bearing
- Rate innovative treatment therapies for HIV infected patients and apply these improved strategies in clinical practice to effectively manage patients
