
Pathways to Recovery in Stroke Rehabilitation

Traumatic injuries remain the primary cause of death in young adults between the ages of 18-50. EMTALA legislation passed by Congress was intended to reduce inappropriate patient referrals to level-1 trauma centers. However, this legislation has had the unwanted affect of making legitimate transfer of seriously injured patients more difficult. As a result, more patients with complex injuries remain at the admitting hospital placing the responsibility for care on the surgeons practicing at non-trauma hospitals. This has increased the need for these surgeons who take emergency call to be current with contemporary methods of fracture management. This course will address the latest techniques and algorithms for the care of patients with complex musculoskeletal problems through a combination of didactic lectures, expert panel case studies, and audience questions.
